- Increasing effectiveness of your / a health service
- What you will do to share learning from your research / activity and disseminate your learning
- The potential benefits it will bring to the patients you care for

When applying for any funding from Thrombosis UK please outline in your application:

- The activity or area of research
- Why you are requesting grant support
- The estimated cost of the activity / project
- The amount you are seeking from Thrombosis UK
- How the funding would be used
- Other sources of income supporting this activity
- The expected outcome and impact of the focused activity
- Other parties involved or planned to be involved with the work
- Explain patient partner involvement in developing this project
- Outline your dissemination policy

Please note:

A clearly thought through application is an essential component of a research or activity proposal and a condition of funding. A clearly thought through and acceptable application should:

- Be project/activity-specific
- Focus on potential outcomes

Research applications should:

- Articulate a clear understanding of the context and needs of users and consider ways for the proposed research to meet these needs or impact upon understandings of these needs
- Outline the planning and management of associated activities including timing, personnel, skills, budget, deliverables and feasibility;
- Include evidence of any existing engagement with relevant users.
